







BACKGROUND

The Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Southern Nevada Action Plan is a community-driven initiative led by the RTC to reduce traffic deaths and serious injuries across Clark County. Through public input, data-driven strategies, and infrastructure improvements, this plan will identify and implement solutions to make roadways safer for everyone—including drivers and vulnerable road users like pedestrians, motorcyclists, cyclists, transit riders, and individuals with disabilities.

WHY IT MATTERS

Southern Nevada has recently seen an alarming rise in fatal and serious injury crashes, and fatalities for vulnerable road users have also risen dramatically. From 2019 to 2022, Clark County experienced:

- 85,495 total crashes
- 623 fatalities
- 65,436 injuries
